

1ST - 2ND GRADE

FIRST TIMERS NEW! Join us for one or both of these introductory overnight camps as we explore nature and give campers a first taste of camp life. Activities for each camp will be different but will include crafts, hikes, live animals, games, beach time, and a campfire. Camp starts at 9am and ends at noon the following day. Lodging in the Barn Retreat Center. Transportation is available to and from Bethel Lutheran Church for an additional \$20/camper. Cost: \$75 for one session or \$140 for both sessions. **Session I: July 2-3, Session II: July 5-6**

2ND - 4TH GRADE

WET AND WILD Explore the watery world of nature by wading in knee deep. Ride the river on an inner tube, canoe an area lake, or splash around in a pond to get up close and personal with frogs, crawdads, giant water bugs and clams. Set up an aquarium, seine for monsters of the deep or try on a pair of flippers as we explore area ponds, lakes, rivers and streams. Don't forget your squirt gun! Base camp in the campground. Cost: \$410 **July 22-27**

2ND - 6TH GRADE

TEPEE PROGRAM Enjoy all that Bethel Horizons has to offer as you grow and learn in community. During this week of outdoor activities, campers will have the opportunity to stay in colorful tepees, cook over an open fire, and sleep under the stars. 2ND - 10TH GRADE

CONFIRMATION CAMP NEW! Congregations and outdoor ministry unite for shared mission during Confirmation Camp at Bethel Horizons! Our focus will center on the ELCA Bible Study curriculum "Flawed and Forgiven." This week-long adventure in faith development is designed to help youth find a closer and more personal relationship with God. We will foster this relationship through growing experiences on the Low and High Ropes Challenge Course, biking on the Military Ridge Trail, canoeing at Twin Valley Lake in Governor Dodge State Park, service projects, and much more. Open to confirmands with at least one year of confirmation experience. Lodging in the Barn Retreat Center. \$410. **July 29-August 3**

NATURE AT NIGHT Which animals come out after the sun goes down? How did the constellations get their names? How do fireflies make their light? 9TH - 11TH GRADE

LEADERS IN TRAINING (L.I.T.) Step into a new role at camp by becoming a Leader in Training! Participants will have the opportunity to work together on the Low and High Ropes Challenge Courses and discover the skills behind being an outdoor leader, including campfires & worship, leading games and activities, outdoor living skills, and canoe training. Time will also be spent on resume building techniques and application processes. Participants should be mature, ready to learn, and prepared to be a role model. Base camp in the Barn Retreat Center. Some nights may be spent outdoors. **Cost: \$390 for Session I and \$350 for Session II;** Week one is a prerequisite for week two. **Session I: July 15-20; Session II: July 22-27**

10TH GRADE AND UP:

COMMUNING WITH CLAY (All levels, age 16 to 91!) This series of workshops is a much loved tradition at Adamah. 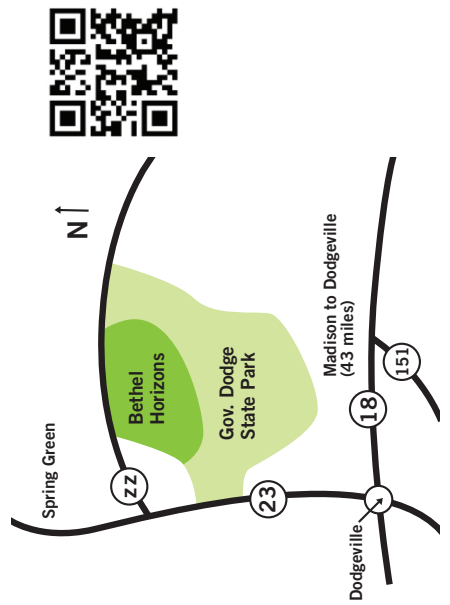
